## Winter Service Plan 2025/26

## Introduction

The Ayrshire Roads Alliance is responsible for providing the winter service for East Ayrshire and South Ayrshire Councils. This includes:

- establishing treatment priorities
- · day to day direction of operations
- · monitoring performance
- liaising with adjoining Councils and Emergency Services

The Winter Service Plan was revised during the summer of 2015 to follow the format of the code of practice 'Well Maintained Highways', which was updated in September 2013.

Additionally, the Ayrshire Roads Alliance Severe Weather Operations Plan is available on request which provides more detailed information.

## Statutory obligations and policy

East Ayrshire and South Ayrshire Councils have a statutory obligation under Section 34 of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984 to prevent snow and ice from endangering the safe passage of pedestrians and vehicles over public roads (this includes carriageways, footways and footpath areas).

## Aim

East and South Ayrshire Councils aim to provide an effective and efficient Winter Service within the resources they have available, and in accordance with 'Well Maintained Highways' to:

- allow the safe passage of vehicles and pedestrians
- · minimise delays due to adverse weather conditions
- ensure winter operations are undertaken safely

The Winter Service Plan sets out how the Winter Service will be provided within each Council's road network.

## Responsibilities

The Head of Service for the Ayrshire Roads Alliance is responsible for delivering and enabling the Winter Service.

The Ayrshire Roads Alliance is responsible for the work involved in providing the Winter Service, including:

- developing the Winter Service to cope with an 'average winter' but having the capability to be
   extended or adapted when winters are more severe or of a longer duration than average
- the production and distribution of the Winter Service Plan
- reviewing and updating the Severe Weather Operations Plan
- liaising with adjacent roads authorities to ensure continuity of service across boundaries
- liaising with Winter Supervisors to ensure the winter service is delivered in the most effective,
   efficient, and economical way, including establishing operational priorities during extreme
   weather conditions
- arranging for weather forecasts, ice prediction reports and road and weather monitoring
   information to be available throughout the winter period
- providing a list of roads designated for priority treatment
- providing a list of roads designated as strategic routes for snow clearing
- providing a list of footways and pedestrian areas designated for priority/treatment

As part of the winter service, full and comprehensive records of all Winter Service activities are maintained, including:

- ensuring all operatives receive adequate and appropriate training in Winter Service activities
   and that those drivers are issued with 'route cards' to record details of the treatment times
- establishing contact numbers for access to emergency service control rooms, public transport operators, local media, and motoring organisations
- arranging for appropriate Transport workshop staff to be available on 24 hours call-out to deal with any serious mechanical breakdown(s)
- ensuring the Transport workshop is notified of any vehicle faults and that they are repaired without delay
- arranging for appropriate specialist vehicles and equipment to be available throughout the winter period
- the checking and calibrating of salt spreading equipment and weighbridges
- arranging for supplies of salt to be available at the start of the overall winter period
- monitoring the salt usage and ensuring supplies are replenished to maintain an appropriate level of salt in the stockpile

- monitoring the weather forecasts and actual weather conditions as well as road surface temperatures and road conditions
- assessing the requirement to carry out precautionary or post-salting treatment or snow clearance on the network; deciding appropriate start times and rates of spread and arranging for the work to be carried out; monitoring effectiveness of treatments and amending instructions, when necessary, due to a change in conditions
- assessing the need to carry out post-salting or snow clearance of the remaining road network during prolonged spells of sub-zero temperatures and ensuring works are carried out when necessary and as resources permit
- liaising, when necessary, with the Road Weather Forecast Provider
- providing accurate and timely information to the East Ayrshire Risk Management Centre and South Ayrshire Monitoring Station
- passing of information on road conditions to each Council's Communications Team as and when required
- monitoring all aspects of the Winter Service and providing information on performance indicators

## Decision making process

The overall Winter Period will be from 18 October 2025 until 18 April 2026, with the Core Winter Period being from the third Saturday of October ending on the third Saturday of April (these periods can be extended if conditions warrant this).

Day-to-day routine operational decisions will be made by the Winter Controller using weather forecasts provided by the Weather Services Provider and road and weather monitoring data.

The Winter Controller will receive the weather forecast each day at 0600hrs, 1200hrs and 1800hrs and will assess and consult on the forecast and any other relevant data and decide what action to take, if any. An instruction will then be issued to the relevant staff and external bodies detailing the action proposed.

Each morning at 0600hrs the Winter Controller will assess the forecast and make a decision for the coming 12 to 24 hour period. This will allow Depot Supervisors to plan their works for the coming day starting at 0800hrs.

At 1800hrs the Winter Controller will assess the latest forecast and adjust (if considered necessary) for the next 12 to 24 hour period.

On receipt of a weather forecast or update, the Winter Controller will reach a decision on action for the next 24 hours from one of the following options:

- 1. Pre-salting to commence immediately after the period of mobilisation.
- 2. Pre-salting to commence at a specified time (e.g. 1900hrs).
- 3. Treatment is likely but start time cannot yet be determined.
- 4. Treatment is possible; conditions being monitored by patrol vehicles.
- 5. No action planned (minimum forecast temperature + 1°C).

#### **Pre-salting**

If a treatment is planned, the Winter Controller will create a decision record which will include the required salt spread rate. Further required treatments such as post-salting or snow clearance will also be recorded.

#### **Post-salting**

Post salting would be carried out on Priority 1 Routes where salt has been washed off due to rain. Remaining roads may be treated by salting as determined by priority, progress, conditions, and resources.

#### **Snow clearing**

Snow clearing operations will be undertaken across the network as conditions dictate.

Two stages of snow clearing can be considered:

- Light falls of undisturbed accumulation of snow reaching a depth of less than 10mm. This
  will normally be dealt with by one or more repeated applications of salt.
- 2. Moderate/heavy falls of snow greater than 10mm in depth that may also be associated with drifting.

These conditions may require the use of ploughs, specialised equipment and/or mechanical excavators in addition to salting. As ploughing may block junctions and side roads, arrangements will be made to remove any resulting accumulations of snow, as resources permit.

When resources permit, normal priority treatment routes and minimum winter network routes (known as snow routes) will be treated to clear snow before remaining Priority 1, Priority 2 and Priority 3 routes are cleared.

Under extreme conditions, greater priority will be given to clearing and treating snow routes.

## Arrangements with adjacent authorities

Reciprocal arrangements are made with adjacent authorities to ensure the most efficient and consistent treatment of routes at boundaries, and co-operation during winter service operations.

- At the boundary of the Trunk Roads Network, Ayrshire Roads Alliance will treat to the give way/stop markings.
- The Trunk Road Operating Company will treat the main trunk road carriageways, slip roads including lanes and splays at acceleration, and declaration lanes and splays.

#### Resilience levels

Resilience for the overall winter period is set at a minimum of 8 days at heavy salting levels, equating to 4400 tonnes of salt.

Heavy salting is calculated as two treatments of the Priority 1 network and one treatment of Priority 2 networks.

During December and January, resilience levels are increased to a minimum of 15 days at heavy salting levels, equating to 8150 tonnes of salt.

If salt stock levels fall below 4400 tonnes, consideration will be given to introducing salt conversion methods. This may include restricting treatment to snow routes and the use of salt/grit mixes.

Should driver levels fall below the required levels for the winter service, the drivers 'off shift' for each week will be required to concentrate on winter duties only, ensuring that the required rest is taken to avoid fatigue and to adhere to the Working Time Directive, unless emergency situations occur.

In the event of an emergency, Priority 1 routes will be treated only and some drivers will cover two routes each, therefore deviating from the 3 hour treatment time to a 6 hour treatment time.

## Carriageway and footway route planning

The pre and post-salting routes for East and South Ayrshire are reviewed on an annual basis taking into account any alterations to the roads which are treated under the specified gritting criteria.

The main treatment options are as follows:

- Precautionary pre-salting
- · Post-salting
- Snow routes

## Precautionary pre-salting of carriageway routes

The following Priority 1 Strategic Routes and Main Distributor Routes will be treated if it is forecast that ice or snow is likely to be present on road surfaces:

- · A70
- · A71
- · A713
- · A735
- · A736
- · A759
- · A719
- · A714
- · A79 (the A77, A78, A76, and M77 are the responsibility of Transport Scotland)
- Safe and reliable access to emergency facilities including fire and rescue, police, ambulance services and hospitals
- Other public services (schools, health centres etc.); access to towns and villages; routes with a high percentage of school traffic; designated public transport routes; access to main industrial and business centres.

Gritting treatments are scheduled to take place between the hours of 10pm and 5am Monday to Sunday.

In extreme conditions and where the forecast merits action, treatments can be actioned during these times although the duty Winter Controller has authority to amend agreed treatments and treatment times if updated forecasts or conditions make this necessary.

There is little benefit and high cost associated with treating roads when traffic is minimal. To be fully effective, de-icing requires the actions of vehicles to help dispersal and to break up snow and ice.

## Post-salting of carriageway routes

Given the presence of ice or snow on roads and a forecast that these conditions will last for a period longer than it would take to treat the roads, appropriate treatment may take place as resources permit

to cover Priority 2, Priority 3 routes and reported trouble spots following the completion of Priority 1 routes.

**Priority 2 routes** will be treated when sub-zero temperatures are forecast to continue to last beyond midday.

**Priority 2 secondary distributor roads,** including B class roads not included on Priority 1 routes, local distributor roads in residential areas.

**Priority 3 routes** will be treated when sub-zero conditions are forecast to continue over an extended period.

Priority 3 local access roads in residential and industrial areas, minor rural through roads and C class roads not included on Priority 1 or Priority 2 routes. Other roads with restricted access and cul-de-sacs not treated during post-salting actions will be treated with suitable special plant, consisting of pickups, crew cabs and footway tractors

#### **Snow clearing on carriageway routes**

While snow is still falling, only the Minimum Winter Network Routes (Priority 1/Snow Routes) will be ploughed and treated to target resources and keep these routes open for traffic.

After snow has stopped falling but is lying, remaining Priority 1 routes will be ploughed and treated before commencing ploughing and treatment on Priority 2 and Priority 3 routes as resources and conditions permit.

During this time additional resources will be called out to plough and treat Priority 2 and Priority 3 routes after snow has stopped or when conditions warrant.

#### Response and treatment times for carriageway treatments

On receipt of a forecast of ice being present during morning peak flow traffic, precautionary salting of routes will be carried out and completed within three hours from the start of treatment.

#### **Emergency salting and ploughing**

The time between the decision to start treatment and the actual start of treatment will be no more than one hour except where pre-planned gritting is scheduled.

#### **Pattern of spreading**

Gritters are set to salt a width of carriageway covering both lanes of single carriageways or both lanes of one side of a dual carriageway.

The gritter will generally travel in the left-hand lane and the spreading pattern will be set to cover both lanes unless multiple passes are required on a wide one-way road.

#### Salt spread rates

The variable nature of winter conditions makes it difficult to define exact treatments and salt applications. Sustained low temperatures occur only rarely. In this event however, account will be taken of the need to increase the rate of spread of salt. Below -11°C the action of salt is ineffective and other measures will be required such as the introduction of salt/grit mixtures.

## Precautionary pre-salting of footway routes

Footways will be considered for treatment if it is forecast that ice or snow is likely to be present on road surfaces or where surfaces are wet, with temperatures forecast to remain below zero until 10am the next working day.

**Priority 1 -** urban shopping areas and precincts and other areas of pedestrian concentration. Where applicable within the Priority 1 footway route, safe and reliable footway access to emergency facilities including fire and rescue, police, ambulance services and hospitals, and other public services (schools, health centres etc.).

**Priority 2 -** includes main access routes to town and village centres; special needs of disabled people or older people where critical footway access is required (residential homes etc.); known problem areas including significant gradients; exposed areas and other topological areas.

Footways are treated as available resources allow.

## Post-salting of footway routes

Priority footways are treated if it is forecast that ice or snow is likely to be present on road surfaces, and temperatures are forecast to remain below zero over a prolonged period.

It is not possible to treat all footways. The Ayrshire Roads Alliance encourages self-help through the placing of grit bins throughout our road network for use by the public as well as winter resilience groups.

## Cycle route treatment

When resources permit, road cycle routes are treated along with the adjacent carriageway. No treatment will be carried out on off-road cycle routes.

# Response and treatment times for footway and cycle route treatments

Priority 1 footway routes should be completed in 5 hours from start of treatment.

Priority 2 footway routes will be instructed for treatment as and when resources permit.

On-road cycle routes will be treated with the adjacent carriageway as resources permit.

Where resources permit, ad hoc visual footway route inspections will be undertaken and footway treatments will commence on instruction.

## Community self-assistance

To improve footway treatment resilience, the Ayrshire Roads Alliance is assisted by community groups known as Winter Resilience Groups. We currently have over 133 Winter Resilience Groups who have received training, salt materials, footway spreading equipment and appropriate PPE, allowing groups to undertake footway gritting treatments within their local areas.

## Location and maintenance of grit bins

Approximately 1066 grit bins are situated locally within our network for self-help by the public. These are topped up on a monthly basis as required, and as resources permit.

The number of grit bins and their locations are continually under review and can be viewed on the Ayrshire Roads Alliance web page.
